
### Market to Market Country Ham Club

### **Beginner Cooking Club**







### APPLE CRUMBLE DESERT

### Ingredients:

- Nonstick cooking spray
- · 4 medium apples for baking
- 1/2 cup quick-cooking oatmeal (uncooked)
- 1/4 cup light or dark brown sugar, packed
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1/3 cup 100% apple juice

### Directions

- 1. Move the oven rack to the center of the oven.
- 2. Preheat the oven to 350° F.
- 3. Spray the bottom and sides of a 9-inch square baking dish with nonstick cooking spray.
- 4. Wash and peel the apples. Cut them into thin slices.
- 5. Spread the apple slices evenly over the bottom of the baking dish.
- 6. In a small bowl, use a fork to mix the oatmeal, brown sugar and cinnamon.
- 7. Spread the oatmeal mix evenly over the apples in the baking dish.
- 8. Lightly pour the apple juice over the oatmeal mixture.
- 9. Cover the dish and bake for 20-30 minutes until apples start to soften.
- 10. Uncover and bake for another 15-20 minutes until apples are soft.
